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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Education remains one of the strongest determinants of economic mobility, social stability, and long-term regional development. Across Nigeria's South- South & South-East region, a significant number of children and young adults from low-income and underserved communities remain excluded from quality education due to inadequate school infrastructure, poor access to learning resources, financial hardship, and limited pathways to higher education, particularly international academic opportunities.

The Education Funding Assistance for Underprivileged Children in the South- South Region, Nigeria, West Africa is a large-scale education intervention designed to address both foundational and advanced educational access challenges through a dual-impact education investment model focused on infrastructure development and human capital advancement.

This proposal seeks funding support in the total sum of **Nine Hundred Million United States Dollars (USD 900,000,000)** to implement two interconnected education development programmes targeted at underserved beneficiaries across the South-South geopolitical region of Nigeria.

To provide a clear overview of the proposed intervention, the project structure is summarised below:

The first component involves the development, construction, equipping, and operational establishment of **250 nursery, primary, and secondary schools** strategically distributed across underserved urban, peri-urban, and rural communities within the region. This component carries a projected funding requirement of **USD 250,000,000** and is intended to significantly expand access to quality foundational education for children currently excluded from formal learning systems due to infrastructural limitations and affordability barriers.

These schools will be designed as modern learning environments with appropriate classrooms, science laboratories, ICT learning centres, libraries, sanitation facilities, administrative blocks, recreational areas, and supporting infrastructure including water and power systems.

The second component involves the establishment of a transformative international scholarship sponsorship programme for **3,000 underprivileged undergraduate and master's degree beneficiaries**, with a projected budget allocation of **USD 650,000,000**.

The scholarship programme will provide comprehensive support covering:

- a) Tuition fees
- b) Accommodation
- c) Academic materials and resources
- d) Living stipends
- e) Healthcare support where applicable
- f) Visa and immigration processing
- g) International travel

- h) Welfare supervision
- i) Mentorship and academic performance monitoring

Priority academic disciplines will include medicine, engineering, education, public policy, science, agriculture, information technology, business, innovation, and other strategically relevant development-focused fields.

By combining infrastructure expansion with global academic sponsorship, this project addresses immediate educational access constraints while building long-term human capital capacity for sustained regional transformation.

The requested funding represents a strategic investment in education, inclusion, opportunity creation, and socio-economic advancement for underprivileged communities in the South-South region of Nigeria.

Introduction and Background

Education is a critical driver of economic growth, social mobility, and long-term development. Yet, access to quality education in Nigeria remains highly unequal, particularly among low-income and underserved populations.

This challenge is significant in the South-South region, comprising Akwa Ibom, Bayelsa, Cross River, Delta, Edo, and Rivers States, South-East are: Abia, Anambra, Ebonyi, Enugu, Imo State where many communities continue to face inadequate educational infrastructure, limited learning resources, and restricted access to higher education opportunities despite the region's economic importance.

Children in underserved communities often face barriers such as poor school facilities, overcrowding, affordability constraints, and limited access to qualified teaching and modern learning resources. For academically capable youth from disadvantaged backgrounds, access to international higher education remains largely out of reach due to financial and structural limitations.

To address these gaps, the **Education Funding Assistance for Underprivileged Children in the South-South Region, Nigeria, West Africa** is designed as a dual-impact intervention focused on foundational education access and advanced human capital development.

enrolment, poor retention, weak learning outcomes, and increased dropout rates.

At the higher education level, financially disadvantaged but academically capable students face major barriers to accessing international education, including tuition costs, accommodation expenses, travel requirements, and lack of structured support.

These challenges have wider socio-economic consequences, including persistent poverty, unemployment, weak workforce development, and underutilisation of human potential.
